A. Church Council

St. Stephen's Council looks to regroup and refocus in 2025. The new group began with 2 new elected members in November and gathered for an orientation in December. At this time, areas of particular focus for each member of Council, as well as a general consideration of what it means to be on Council, were held.

Moving forward, besides ongoing business, they will be joined by Bob Dieter and your stewardship ideas in January for the purpose of setting some goals.

In February, Council will concentrate on Youth and some developments there (see below). St. Stephen's Council also has an ongoing discussion of our Constitution to revisit.

Have anything to add? Have anything you'd like Council to think about? Let us know!

B. St. Stephen/Rejoice Cooperative

In January, our ministry with Rejoice will continue to link up with other congregations, including Trinity; Kent and St. Mark; Tallmadge with a joint gathering at St. Mark soon.

Wondering what it's all about?

Well, the Northeastern Ohio Synod has begun directing us all towards *The One Church Experiment*, and this fits in with that. Where worship gatherings have space to fill, congregations have resources to share, and Lutherans are all over the place, our efforts to covenant with and work cooperatively with other congregations is a forward-looking place to minister and serve.

C. Lydia's Pantry, Open Table, and Food Scarcity

The more we collect, give, and invite people to meals and to our pantry at St. Stephen, the clearer the enormous need appears. So, I have begun meeting regularly at the Stow City Center with the re-constituted Stow Cares Group. Together, this group considers food scarcity city-wide and gathers resources to address it.

In the year ahead, our ministry around food is sure to lead the way as our primary call into service. It benefits from this collaboration and there is space available for you to volunteer or contribute to St. Stephen's food ministries in many, many ways.

D. St. Stephen's Youth

In 2025, our ministry to youth will be a special emphasis. Affirmation of Baptism, Sunday School, annual events like Youth Quake and (hopefully) camp, and an ultimate goal of attending the 2027 ELCA Youth Gathering in Minneapolis are of particular note.

I also hope to reconstitute our middle school age ministry or what was called Confirmation. As such, Faith Friends, or partnering students with adults with similar gifts or interests, will probably be renewed.

All of these are things you should hear more about throughout 2025.

E. St. Stephen's Bulletins

No, we aren't skimping.

When I met you in 2015, St. Stephen did not print full bulletins. They did not look like they do today. Because I was wading into a sort of reformation of worship, I expanded the bulletins to help walk us all through it together. Where we are now is different from where we were then.

Over the years, they have changed some. The prayers of the people have bigger parts for the whole congregation. The front has been reduced. The font has changed.

You have probably also noticed that we now have a one-page version of the bulletin that directs back to our hymnals which are found in each pew. You've probably wondered what's up. There's a chance you've even tried to avoid these.

Well, keep in mind: the only constant is change. Lutherans – especially when it comes to our worship – are Reformed AND always reforming. Worship changed drastically with Covid and the reopening of our facilities. We now regularly stream worship.

As ELCA Lutherans, we will remain a liturgically rooted congregation.

The word liturgy literally means the work of the people. The one-page bulletin returns the liturgy to the people instead of simply making it a task for the church office.

The world is, either against our will or with it, digital; and digital bulletins have also become part of who we are.

Behind all of this, worship at St. Stephen should center on Word and Sacrament. It should be a place of comfort, but also be E.P.I.C. – which is my way of saying experiential, participatory, image-rich, and connective.

Our bulletins, as an entry way into worship (and thus into Word and Sacrament) should encourage mindfulness and fit the world we live in, but never supersede the action or the content of the service itself.

Yes, a lot is going on with the paper we hand you each week. But it isn't about the costs. It's about worship.

F. LENT 2025

If Deitrich Bonhoeffer is a clear and powerful example in faith (and he is), we'll investigate the life of another famous and influential Lutheran this year: Soren Kierkegaard. Haven't heard of him? Not sure if you care? Following Luther himself, Kierkegaard is probably the most influential Lutheran ever and his ideas have affected you more than you may know.

There's more to come, but this is an early peek into what I hope to share in Lent this year.

G. Save the Date and Various Opportunities to Grow

- Yes, it is early, but St. Stephen will host Rise Against Hunger on September 20, 2025. This ministry brings food and packaging to sites across the country to be sorted and packed and then distributes them. We'll need as many as 45 volunteers! Mark your calendars now!
- There are a lot of ways to grow and connect at St. Stephen, and (since the theme of this Pastor John Take Over Edition is New Year's Resolutions) I thought I'd list many of them here for you to pray about. Try a new one this year!

May God continue to strengthen and encourage you in 2025!




Charles Brown

Council Meeting Minutes from: Sunday, December 15, 2024

Attendees: Pastor John Corsi, Michelle Rousseau, Judy Prinz, Kevin Strohl, Joan Conaway, Chuck Conaway, Larry Kribs, Mark Stultz

Absent: Daniel Holm

- Council president called the meeting to order at approximately 11:45 AM
- Meeting minutes from last month approved by the full Council
- Pastor John reported that four (4) different companies looked at the failed fellowship hall boiler located in the basement; thus far, only two (2) quotes have been presented to the church office, and they are quite different as each company had formulated different ideas pertaining to the true scope of the project
- Mark stated that it appears the K Company has a better grasp of what needs to be done (Mark's calculations indicate that we most probably need to replace the failed existing unit with a new 505,000 BTU boiler system)
- There was some discussion regarding the scope of the project and whether or not the church needs to add additional radiator units in the larger/open portion of the fellowship hall; Mark stated that the church would not need to install additional radiator units as the new boiler could also power a forced air system to adequately heat the entire space (existing radiators are located only in the classrooms)
- Kevin asked about a warranty for the new system and what that might look like; the church will need to negotiate terms for warranty in the final contract
- Mark made a motion to accept the quote from K Company on a conditional basis; this was seconded by Larry, with a third motion from Michelle; all members voted in favor of this motion
- Pastor John stated that there are still some ongoing issues with one of the other two boilers in the building (heating of the sanctuary), and there will likely be costs incurred in the near future to address this as well (Note: there are three (3) total boiler units in the building)

- The discussion then focused on how the church would be paying for a new boiler for the fellowship hall and the way the church council would be presenting this to the greater congregation; and there is also the issue of paying for upkeep on the boiler dedicated to the sanctuary
- Pastor John does not recommend using any of the endowment fund to cover any of these costs
- The council discussed the various options available for paying for the new boiler and the upkeep of the other boiler; it seems that the church will need to have a total sum of about \$50,000 to cover the expenses for replacement and maintenance costs
- Mark made a motion to allocate up to \$50,000 from the church's Thrivent Money Market mutual fund with options to reduce this amount by funds that could/might be received from congregational donations and/or the General Fund; this motion was seconded by Larry; all members voted in favor of the motion
- Mark made a motion to schedule a congregational meeting for next Sunday, December 22nd to present this plan to the congregation; seconded by Michelle; all members voted in approval
- Mark made a motion to adjourn the meeting; seconded by Judy; all approved.
- Mark closed with prayer
